I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the Competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the Competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

GENERAL INFORMATION, RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All judges' decisions are final. No exhibitor or person shall approach a judge on any matter unless they first obtain permission from the Steward. Anyone disregarding this rule may be asked to cancel all entries and forfeit all entry and other fees.
2. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes if in its opinion the entries so warrant and in accordance with USEF rules governing same.
3. There will be a Post Entry Fee of \$20.00 for all entries received after 4 PM of the night before the show. There will be no penalty fee for entering additional classes the day of the show.
4. There will be a \$50.00 fee for all returned checks.
5. A trophy and eight ribbons will be presented in all classes unless otherwise stated.
6. All exhibitors cannot ride anywhere on the show grounds without wearing protective headgear that has passed the current ASTM/SEI standards. Harnesses must be secured and if said headgear has a brim, it must be flexible or semi-flexible. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until his headgear is properly in place.
7. All dogs must be leashed.
8. Poling is not permitted on the show grounds.
9. Membership forms and class specifications for all organizations are available at the secretary's office.
10. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have valid temporary license may operate any of the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
11. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
12. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.
13. Under Rhode Island law, an equine professional, unless he can be shown to have failed to be in the exercise of due care, is not liable for any injury to, or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to Chapter 21, of title 4 of the general laws.
14. Show ring will be available for warm-up rounds from 6:30 AM to 7:45 AM. Last number taken at 7:30 AM. Warm-up rounds are \$20.00. Additional unjudged or judged warm-up sessions may be available as indicated on the schedule if time permits. Warm-up rings outside will be open all day.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

LEADLINE

61. LEADLINE Entry Fee \$15.00
Open to riders 6 years of age or under. To be shown collectively at the walk, and individually at the trot or jog. To be judged with emphasis on equitation; also suitability and manners of mount to be considered. Leader to be on foot and must be over 14 years of age. Appropriate dress required for rider, but leader need not be in riding attire but must be neatly and appropriately dressed. Appointments not required.

62. LEADLINE SUITABILITY Entry Fee \$15.00
Open to riders 6 years of age and under. To be shown collectively at the walk, and individually at the trot or jog. To be judged with emphasis suitability and manners of mount. Leader to be on foot and must be over 14 years of age. Riders may not compete in any other class except Leadline.

WALK/TROT – SHORT STIRRUP – LONG STIRRUP

1. OPPORTUNITY SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION – NEHC “C” Entry Fee \$20.00
Short Stirrup Hunter Seat Equitation Over Fences. To be shown over at least 4 fences not exceeding 18 inches in height, with no combinations. Fences may be taken at a trot or canter at the option of the rider.

2. OPPORTUNITY SHORT STIRRUP EQ. CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS–NEHC “C”
To be held over fences not exceeding 18 inches. Fences may be taken at a trot or canter at the option of the rider. Entry Fee \$25.00

8. OPPORTUNITY SHORT STIRRUP HUNT SEAT EQ. ON THE FLAT–NEHC “C”
To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to halt and back. (No more than 8 riders to canter at one time.) Entry Fee \$20.00

5. OPPORTUNITY MHJ SHORT STIRRUP MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
Open to all Junior riders who have not reached their 13th birthday as of December 1. To perform over at least four fences not to exceed 18”. Riders may not compete in any other equitation class other than Short Stirrup Equitation at any show and shall not have competed in a class jumping over 18”. Any Short Stirrup Equitation class or Championship class may be used as the qualifying class as long as the show program specifies. At least 4 riders must complete the course in order for points to count. To qualify: 10 points. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class.

OPPORTUNITY SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER
DIVISION - NEHC “C” Entry Fee \$50.00 Division \$20.00 per class
Open to riders 12 years of age or under. Rider and horse or pony combination cannot have competed in a jumping class exceeding 18” in height. To be shown over a course of 4 to 8 fences at a height of 18” without combinations. The fences shall be cross rails or verticals with no combinations. The under saddle class will be shown at a walk, trot & canter with only 8 horses or ponies to canter at one time.

52. MHJ JUNIOR MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
Open to junior members who have not reached their 18th birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3’3” in height. One or more tests of the top 4 contestants may be requested at the judge’s discretion. (USEF Tests 1-19). To fill ,at least 4 competitors must complete the course. Ten points required to qualify for the finals.(10,8,6,4,2,1).

45. MHJ ADULT MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
Open to all Amateur Adult competitors to perform over at least 8 fences 2’9” to 3’0”, spreads not to exceed fence height, with at least two changes of direction and a combination. At the finals, class will be divided 18-30 and 31 and over. At least [3] riders must complete the course in order for points to count. To qualify: 10 points. Once qualified, riders may continue to show in the class. Riders may not cross-enter into the Adult Mini-Medal qualifying class or Adult Mini-Medal Finals.

58. PESSOA/USEF NATIONAL JUNIOR HUNT SEAT MEDAL Entry Fee \$35.00
Open to Junior Active Members of the Federation who have not yet reached their 18th birthday. Application for membership can be made direct to the Federation office or the exhibitor can join prior to the class through the steward. To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles at 3’6” which must include one combination including an over and two changes of direction (change of lead) after the first obstacle.

59. ASPCA HORSEMANSHIP Entry Fee \$35.00
Open to Junior Riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Rider and trainer must be current members of the ASPCA/NHSAA, and must show their ASPCA numbers on the entry blank. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences at 3’6” with or without wings. A minimum of twelve riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of horse. The Under Saddle performance of those riders selected to show under saddle shall count 50%. Only one rider per horse. USEF Tests 1-19. To fill a class six (6) competitors must complete the course.

55. NATIONAL CHILDREN’S MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences 2’9 to 3’ in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a hunter or jumper type course and must include at least 2 changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.: water jump Liverpool) are not permitted. The top 4 riders or 20% of the first round competitors, whichever is greater, are required to perform at least 2 individual tests. (USEF Tests 1-19). An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider’s score announced at the completion of their round. At least 6 ribbons shall be awarded in each qualifying class.

49. ARIAT NATIONAL ADULT MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
Open to Amateur members of the USEF and CEF who are eligible to compete in the Adult Amateur Hunter Section at this show. Effective December 1, 1997 a rider may not compete at the same horse show in any hunter or equitation class in which the jumps exceed three feet, three inches (3’3”). To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 3’ in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-19. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider’s score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class.

four competitors must complete the course. One win required to qualify for the Finals. Contestants that are qualified are no longer eligible for the preliminary classes. Violation will forfeit eligibility for the finals for that year.

47. NEHC ADULT MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
Open to adult members of the New England Horseman's Council. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not exceeding 3'. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion (USEF Tests 1 – 17). To fill a class at least four competitors must complete the course. All contestants must wear proper attire. Contestants that are qualified are no longer eligible for the preliminary classes. Violation will forfeit eligibility for the finals for that year.

51. SEHA JUNIOR MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
Open to junior members who have not reached their 18th birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3'3" in height. One or more tests of the top 4 contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF Tests 1-19). To fill, at least 4 competitors must complete the course. Ten points required to qualify for the finals. (10,6,4,2,1,1/2). Once qualified, you may still enter the class. If you won the Junior Medal at the Finals, you are no longer eligible for this class.

44. SEHA ADULT MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
Open to adult members of the Southeast Hunter Association. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3' in height. One or more tests of the top 4 contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF Tests 1-19). To fill, at least 4 competitors must complete the course. Ten points required to qualify for the finals (10,6,4,2,1,1/2). Once qualified, you may still enter the class. If you won the Adult Medal at the Finals, you are no longer eligible for this class.

30. SEHA MINI MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
Open to SEHA Members who have not reached their 15th birthday as of December 1st of the current year and have not competed in any horsemanship class in which the rider is required to jump higher than 3' with the exception of the USE Federation Pony Medal. All contestants are to compete over a course not to exceed 8 fences and not less than 6 fences, at a height not to exceed 2'6". No combinations. One or more individual tests may be requested at the judge's discretion (USEF tests 1-5). Contestants are not allowed to cross enter into the National Children's Medal, WIHS, MHC, NEHC and RIHA Medal, USEF Medal, USET or the ASPCA Horsemanship class at any show during the year. To fill a class, at least 4 competitors must complete the course. Ten points to qualify for the Finals. (10, 6, 4, 2, 1, ½). Once qualified you may still enter the class. If you have won the Mini Medal Finals, you are no longer eligible for this class.

28. MHJ MINI MEDAL Entry Fee \$30.00
Open to all junior riders who have not reached their 15th birthday as of December 1, 2002 (exception Maiden and Novice riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current year). To perform over at least 6 fences not to exceed 2'6". At least 4 riders must complete the course in order for points to count. Ten points required to qualify. (10, 8, 6, 4, 2, 1). Once qualified, riders may continue to show in class. Riders may cross-enter into the Children's Equitation Medal but can only compete in either the Mini Medal or Children's Equitation Medal but not both.

6. LONG STIRRUP EQUITATION Entry Fee \$15.00
Riders must be 13 years and over. Specifications shall be the same as Short Stirrup Equitation over fences.

7. LONG STIRRUP EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS Entry Fee \$20.00
Riders must be 13 years and over. Specifications shall be the same as Short Stirrup Equitation Championship Class.

10. LONG STIRRUP EQUITATION FLAT Entry Fee \$15.00
Riders must be 13 years and over. Specifications shall be the same as Short Stirrup Equitation

LONG STIRRUP HUNTER DIVISION (unrated)
Entry Fee \$50.00 Division \$20.00 per class
Open to riders 13 years of age or older. Same specifications as Short Stirrup Hunter.

11. WALK TROT EQUITATION – NEHC "C" Entry Fee \$15.00
Open to riders who have not reached their eleventh birthday. Open to horses or ponies. Riders in this division not eligible for classes requiring entries to canter.

12. WALK TROT PLEASURE CLASS – NEHC "C" Entry Fee \$15.00
Open to riders who have not reached their eleventh birthday. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog ONLY. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance.

60. WALK TROT RAILS CLASS Entry Fee \$15.00
Open to riders who have not reached their eleventh birthday. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog ONLY over 4 rails. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance.

PLEASURE

13. RIHA PLEASURE HORSE CLASS Entry Fee \$15.00
Open to horses ordinarily used for pleasure purposes and are owned by members of the R.I. Horsemen's Association. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring, with light rein, but still maintaining contact with horse's mouth. Must be asked to back. Shall be judged on manners, performance, and quality in that order.

14. NEHC OPEN PLEASURE HORSE OR PONY – NEHC "C" Entry Fee \$15.00
Open to members and non-members. Open to all horses and ponies ordinarily used for pleasure purposes with no limitation as to the status of rider or place of residence. To be shown at walk, trot or jog, canter or lope. Loose rein on command of judge only, but with no loss of contact. Will be required to back. Shall be judged on manners, performance and quality in that order all horses shall be judged on their respective merits regardless of type.

Runs all day at various heights. No limitations as to status of horse or rider.

To fill a class, at least four competitors must complete the course. Special Note: For the finals, the judge shall be required to work-off the top four contestants.

AMATEUR ADULT EQUITATION - NEHC "C"

On the Flat. To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Martingales prohibited. Judge may require additional tests. Over Fences. To be judged over fences not to exceed 3'. Wings are optional. Judge may require additional tests. Championship class may be held. Specifications same as regular class.

43. Amateur Adult equitation over fences Entry Fee \$20.00

48. MARSHALL & STERLING ADULT MEDAL (3')

Entry Fee \$30.00

Open to Adult and Amateur Riders. To be shown over minimum of 8 fences at 3' including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals.

54. MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDREN'S MEDAL - Horse

Entry Fee \$30.00

Open to Junior Riders on horses who are not competing at the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3'3". To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences the required height including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals. No cross entry of rider into the Marshall & Sterling Children's Pony Medal at the same show.

57. MARSHALL & STERLING JUNIOR MEDAL 3'6" Entry Fee \$30.00

Open to Junior riders. To be shown over minimum of 8 fences at 3'6" including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals.

56. NEHC JUNIOR MEDAL

Entry Fee \$30.00

Open to junior members of the New England Horseman's Council who have not reached their eighteenth birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not exceeding 3'3". 1st-10, 2nd-6, 3rd-4, 4th-2, 5th-1, 6th-1/2, Champion 10, Reserve Champion 6. All questions regarding points must be submitted in writing no later than November 9, 2011.
- Points will start with the first show of the season (12/03/11). Awards will be presented at the final show of the season (11/11/12).
- Double points for SPS Medal Classes and Hunter Classics at the Medal Show.
- Points earned in Leadline and Short Stirrup do not count towards the High Point Rider award.
